Safety Conclave 2024

The QCFI Mumbai Chapter, a dynamic and progressive organization, hosted its first Safety Conclave on July 13, 2024, at the Corporate Management Development Centre, RCF Ltd, Trombay. The theme was "Innovating the Future of Safety Practices - A Step towards Achieving Global Leadership in Safety."

For over three decades, the chapter has organized events focused on quality concepts, helping organizations excel. The conclave aimed to share best safety practices, enhance skills, and empower organizations to achieve superior performance.

Mr. Rituraz Mehta, Chief Risk Officer, Safety & Business Excellence, Adani Power and Mr. V. K. Jawale, Chief General Manager (Complex & Maintenance), RCF Ltd, Trombay, inaugurated the Conclave as Chief Guest & Guest of Honor respectively by lighting the Lamp. Mr. R.K. Singh, Vice President, JSW, Dolvi graced the Conclave as Convenor.









The Conclave began with Mr. Henry Samuel, Jt. Secretary, Mumbai Chapter welcoming the participants and briefing the audience about Safety and Fire rules, assembly and exit points in case of emergency and about CMD Centre and nearby areas, with the help of slides.

He referred to a special drive by QCFI for bringing in quality and safety awareness. Rapid industrialisation has shown remarkable progress in organisations and has acted as catalyst to enhance safety performance. Our aim is not to give knowledge but to inspire action, he concluded. He gave kudos to QCFI committee, panellists and speakers for making this event happen in a successful manner.









Mr. V.K. Kaun Banega Quality Champion – Quiz Competition











- There is a need of training the group leaders on PowerPoint and take follow up of work done by the participants of each group.





- Had to travel to discuss and find new interested groups at different locations and arranging for requirements.
- Convening the topic of awareness on environment too in the allotted time.
- Some of them were on fasting and for them the tea and snacks provided helped to end their fasting in time with energy.
- Help was taken from office for providing writing pad, pen, form and hand bills in Hindi to all participants.

PQCDSM- उत्पादकवता, गुणवत्ता, किंमत, वितरण, सुरक्षितता आणि नैतिकता. हे अनेक कारखान्यांमध्ये आढळते. कारखाना व्यवस्थापन केवळ उत्पादन वाढीवर लक्ष केंद्रित करते आणि गुणवत्ता व किंमत विसरून जाते. दुसऱ्या कारखान्यांमध्ये सहसा आढळत नाही. आम्ही हे समजावून सांगू इच्छितो की, इतर सर्व पॅरामीटर्स सुधारण्याचे एकमेव मापदंड हे नैतिकता Moral आहे. संस्थात्मक वर्तन Organizational Behaviour मोजण्याच्या मदतीने आम्ही कर्मचाऱ्यांची नैतीकता वाढवू शकतो. "अक्षम व्यवस्थापक कर्मचाऱ्यांचा ताण वाढवतात." जर नैतिकता कमी असेल तर PQCDS मध्ये समस्या निर्माण होतील. त्यामुळे उत्पादनात घट, खर्चात वाढ, अधिक अपघात आणि वितरणाच्या साखळीत व्यत्यय येऊ शकतो. नैतिकता वाढीसाठी, आपण लोकांच्या वर्तनाची काळजी घेतली पाहिजे.

एक उत्पादन कारखाना ज्यांच्याकडे दर्जेदार उत्पादन आणि प्रक्रियांचा चांगला सेटअप आहे. सर्व कर्मचारी त्यांच्या तरुण वयात कठोर परिश्रम करीत होते. ५३ ते ५५ वर्षांवरील ज्येष्ठ कामगारांना कामातील बदल असहा झाला. हताश झालेले कर्मचारी काम करू लागले. पण नीच काम होत नव्हते. अनेक कर्मचारी शारीरिकदृष्ट्या अयोग्य असल्यामुळे या कामाचा ताण इतर कर्मचाऱ्यांवर पडला. तेही हताश झाले, उत्पादनावर वाईच नैतिक प्रभाव, अधिक थांबणे, अधिक नकार आणि पुन्हा प्रक्रिया वाईट चक्रात कारखाना अडकला.





त्यांच्या फिनिश उत्पादनाची गुणवत्ता आणि वितरण साखळी विस्कळीत झाली आहे. फॅक्टरी ऑपरेटिंग स्टोअर्स Consumables साहित्याचा वापर वाढला. गैरप्रकारांमळे यंत्रसामग्री बिघडते, व्यवस्थापनाच्या अपयशामुळे या प्लॅंटमध्ये अधिकाऱ्यांसह कर्मचाऱ्यांची नैतिकता खालावली. PQCDS मध्ये समस्या निर्माण झाल्या. "व्यवस्थापन अपयश म्हणजे संघटनात्मक आणि कार्यात्मक संघ नियंत्रित करण्याच्या कर्तव्याची कमतरता.

आपण "इंडस्ट्री 4.0"च्या दिशेने वाटचाल करत असताना, आम्हाला आमच्या उत्पादनाची गुणवत्ता वाढवण्याची गरज आहे. आम्हाला जागतिक उत्पादनांशी स्पर्धा करायची आहे. "ग्राहक हा राजा आहे."ग्राहक कमी किमतीत,जलद वितरणात उत्तम दर्जा प्रदान करते. उत्पादनांची गुणवत्ता ग्राकाद्वारे गुणवत्ता ग्राहकाद्वारे निर्धारित केली जाते. ग्राहक प्रथम येत नाहीत. कर्मचारी प्रथम येतात. आपण आपल्या कर्मचाऱ्यांची काळजी घेतल्यास, ते उत्पादनांची काळजी घेतील. सर्व कर्मचाऱ्यांना प्रसन्न वाडले पाहिजे. यामुळे समूहाचे मनोबल वाढेल. नैतिकता वाढल्याने आपल्या उत्पादनांची गुणवत्ता वाढेल....


